About Us

The Centre for Global Studies, earlier known as Developing Countries Research Centre (drc) was set up by the University of Delhi on 20th April 1993 under the Board of Interdisciplinary Program through Ordinance XV-A. The academic space so created soon became a hub for teachers, students and researchers engaged in researching developing societies of Asia, Africa and Latin America. The year 2004 was a historic moment in the life of drc. Vide Ordinance XX (9) it acquired the status of a constituent of the Faculty of Social Sciences, though it was formally inaugurated by Professor G. Ram Reddy, Chairperson, UGC, on 5 August 1994. It was supported by the UGC during initial years.

In pursuit of its objectives, the Centre has organized seminars and conferences both at national and international levels. At times it has organised events in collaboration with prestigious institutions such as the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, AKUT Group of Uppsala University (Sweden), Max Mueller Bhavan, Centre for the Study of Developing Societies (CSDS), Aligarh Muslim University, International History Congress, V.V. Giri National Labour Institute, Central Social Welfare Board, Women's Studies and Development Centre, Planning Commission, Institute for Human Development, DESTIN of the London School of Economics and Political Science, DFID, Japan Foundation, Vidyajyoti and the constituent colleges of the University of Delhi. Scholars from across the board, such as Political Science, Economics, Sociology, History, Geography, Education, Philosophy, Psychology, Literature, Film and media studies have been involved in this effort. The main objective is to thematize knowledge so gained and critically engage students with such insights while teaching at the undergraduate and postgraduate level in the vast network of Delhi University. Above all, the objective is to build drc as a centre that can act as a springboard of critical and creative theory. The Centre ensures criticality and

creativity in its academic work by entailing two key things in the main. It structures its academic activity in a way that builds an interface between inputs gathered from academics and grass root activists, which turn out to be a critical laboratory of testifying knowledge for both, theory and practice. The other key aspect is that the Centre encourages scholars to adopt methods of academic engagement that rescue disorientations in knowledge production, which generally occur while studying developing societies from the dominant paradigms of the West. The larger endeavour is to have an alternative world-view of how to look at issues related to culture, nationalism, gender, sexuality, religious minorities and other narratives.

The Centre acquired a new currency with Prof. Sunil K Choudhary at the helm of affairs as Director since July 2015. A Gold Medalist from the University of Delhi and recipient of several awards and accolades, including the very prestigious the ‘Global South Award 2014’, Prof. Choudhary has set examples of high moral standard and probity in academic and public life for Fellows of the Centre. As he rightly calls himself ‘Pratham Sevak’, Prof. Choudhary has been able to inculcate in all a spirit of togetherness, so characteristic of a ‘Parivar’. The Centre has seven committees headed by fellow conveners. These committees include Purchase, Seminars/Conferences, Library, Website, Gender Sensitization, Printing/Publication and Scrap. The Advisory Committee headed by Hon’ble Vice Chancellor is the apex decision making body of the Centre, while the Fellow Council and Research Committee are meant for discussing various issues of academic interest. All the fellows are members of these committees. The fellows and conveners meet regularly in their respective committees and contribute to the corporate life of the Centre.

The Fellow Council meets on the 14th date of every month. The Fellow Council discussion is preceded by an academic discourse covering issues of contemporary relevance. For all research related decisions, the Centre has the Research Committee which meets quarterly to discuss, deliberate and decide on the research issues. With much efforts and pursuance by the director of the esteemed centre, the University of Delhi in its notification dated 14 September 2021 vide Executive Council Resolution No. 8-6 has changed the nomenclature of Developing Countries Research Centre [dcrc] as **Centre for Global Studies [CGS]**.

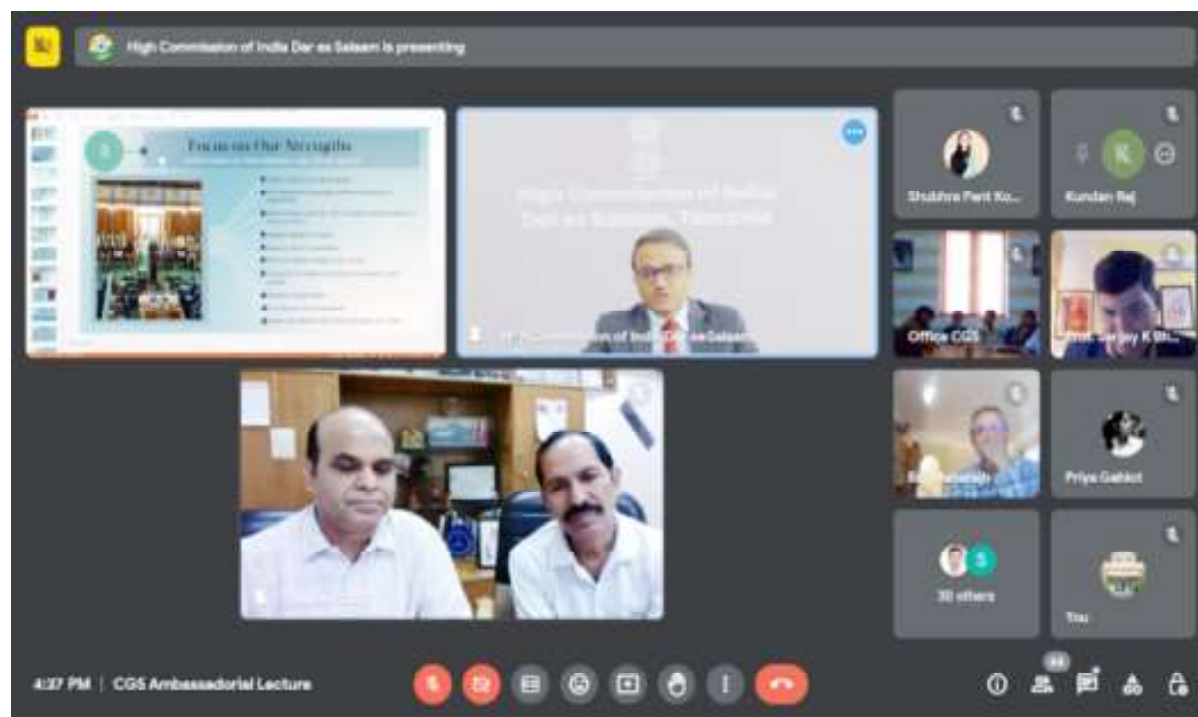
Academic Activities and Programs at the Centre during 2023-24

The Centre organized various activities in the academic year 2023-24 which is an achievement in itself. The Annual Report apart from providing an overview of the Centre, gives a glimpse of Centre's major activities in the previous year to its readers.

I. Conferences, Seminars and Workshops

i) The Fourth Ambassadorial Lecture: Indian High Commissioner to Tanzania

The Centre organised 4th Ambassadorial Lecture on the occasion of Africa Day on 25th May 2023. The theme of the online lecture was "India-Africa in the 21st Century: A Changing Perspective". His Excellency Shri Binaya Srikanta Pradhan, Indian High Commissioner to Tanzania was the keynote speaker. Prof. Brij Maharaj, University of KwaZulu-Natal chaired the programme and Prof. Sanjay Bhardwaj, SIS, JNU was the Guest of Honour. All the panelists asserted having a dynamic partnership



between African Union and India focusing on overall development and growth. The current condition of Africa was discussed to highlight the political economy of the continent.

ii) Two-Day Social Science Colloquium on ‘Philosophy of Gita’

In association with the Ministry of Culture, Government of India, the Centre organized a Two-Day Social Science Colloquium titled, ‘Philosophy of Gita: Lessons for the Youth’ under the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav [AKAM] program during 13-14 August 2023. The Two-Day Colloquium sought to transmit the philosophy of Gita amongst the youth by galvanizing their energies and streamlining their role for New India of the 21st Century. The Colloquium aimed at encapsulating the ideas on The Art of Karma, The Art of Dharma, Statecraft, and leadership Techniques and Countering the Misinterpretations of Gita by engaging renowned social scientists, activists, academicians, politicians, and civil servants nationwide. The Social Science Colloquium has also provided a platform to the central and state universities in India in terms of presentation and dissemination of the Indian knowledge system premised on ancient scriptures and literature.



The program started with a warm welcome address by Prof Sunil K Choudhary, Director, Centre for Global Studies, University of Delhi. Highlighting three decades journey of the Centre, he threw light

upon its unparalleled way of functioning in teaching and learning, publication and administration and discipline and governance. The biggest strength of the Centre is that it has acquired the status of a *Parivar* developing inter-personal relationships with all sections of the society. v) CGS Book Release and Discussion on India@75: A Changing Electoral Democracy

India@75: A Changing Electoral Democracy, a book written by Acharya Sunil K Choudhary was released in the presence of Shri Alok Kumar, Working President, Vishwa Hindu Parishad, New Delhi during the valedictory session of the Social Science Colloquium held on 14 August 2023.



The author of the book, Prof Sunil K Choudhary addressed the audience with the underlining features of the book which seeks to present a trajectory landscape of new trends and transformation seen in the changing nature of India's electoral democracy in 75 years of its evolution. The book has thoroughly decoded the nature of 17 Lok Sabha and 403 State Assembly elections held in post-independence India. In this context, Prof Choudhary has unfolded the significant characteristics of the different chapters which emphasize upon the new conceptualizations ranging from identifying new typologies of the voters

to categorizing their orientation of voting. The book appears to be a torch-bearer to the readers seeking understanding of India's electoral democracy from the 1950s till the contemporary times.

The Centre also organised a Book Discussion on the same book on 14 January 2024. The event's keynote speaker was Shri Ram Bahadur Rai, Director of Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts. The Event was chaired by Dr. Mahesh Chandra Sharma, head of Ekatma Manav Darshan Anusandhan Evam Vikas Pratisthan. Guest of Honour was Shri Raj Kumar Bhatia, former chancellor's nominee, University of Delhi. The book is published by Aakar Publications. KK Saxena of Aakar Publication also graced the occasion.



The book India @ 75 covers an in-depth and nuanced study of India's electoral democracy. It is a one-stop solution for keen scholars of Indian Politics. It covers various aspects of Indian Democracy and gives an academic perspective to the landmark events of politics in India.

The book has concepts and theorizations that give it a unique dimension. The keynote speaker Shri Ram Bahadur Rai emphasized that the book in itself is a great attempt to study the mother of democracy

as an electoral democracy. The event was organized on 14th January, 2024 at the auditorium of the Centre for Global Studies and was attended by students, scholars and faculties of the University of Delhi.

vi) The Book Release and Discussion Program on *DELHI 2023: Changing Democracy, Transforming Polity*

During the same academic year, the Centre organised another book release and discussion on its much-awaited collective work, 'Delhi 2023: Changing Democracy, Transforming Polity'. The Chief

The event was also graced with Shri Ajay K Mehra, Provident Fund Commissioner, Minister of Labour and Employment, Government of India as Special Guest on the occasion. Shri Ashish Gosain, Joint Managing Director, Har Anand Publication was the Guest of Honour. The event was coordinated under the supervision of Director of the Centre, Prof Sunil K Choudhary.



This book is an outcome of the Election Survey conducted under the series of ‘CGS Samiksha’. It is an analytical work based on over one lakh samples collected by the Centre for 2017 Delhi Assembly Election Survey. It is an edited book, with a collection of seven chapters studying the different paradigms of Delhi electoral politics. The Book has been edited by Sunil K Choudhary, Abhay Prasad Singh and Mahesh Kaushik. The book is a collaborative effort by researchers and fellows associated with the Centre for Global Studies. This book is a work of commitment and conviction undertaken over a period of three years. It is a panoptic, holistic and analytical study of Delhi Assembly Elections, 2020.

vii) CGS Webinar: Pakistan and Electoral Democracy

Cherishing the vision of global politics, the Centre for Global Studies (CGS) organized a lecture on the current trend of electoral politics for all its stakeholders, from fellows to faculty, students to scholars and academicians to audience. Studies of elections and the voting behaviour hold a central theme in the current quarter. To enrich our knowledge and understanding about one of our neighbouring countries, the centre organized an enlightening session on “Pakistan and Electoral Democracy: An Indian Perspective” held on Thursday, 8 February 2024. The session was chaired by the Director of the



Centre, Sunil K. Choudhary, who stressed upon the convergence between the nations, India and Pakistan. He looked at the electoral democracy of Pakistan from 3P Model encapsulated as; Parliamentary Politics, Party Politics and Populist Pragmatic Politics.

The lecture was delivered by an esteemed author, journalist and social worker, Shri Tarun Vijay who has

been a regular visitor to Pakistan and has closely watched its electoral democracy. The Speaker highlighted two different ways of looking at elections in Pakistan. He emphasized on the impacts of the election on the relationship with India as well as on the people of Pakistan. Having the 12th General election in Pakistan, the issues like poverty, development, unemployment and land reform which have become some key concerns for people.

Interestingly, Shri Tarun Vijay underlined on the command of elections where, the vote is cast by the people but is severely influenced by the army of Pakistan. Thereby, one can see a major contest among the leading political parties; Pakistan Muslim League(N) led by Nawab Sharif, Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) led by Imran Khan and Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) by Bilawal Zardari Bhutto. In this insightful session, the speaker also highlighted about the Indian diplomacy by talking about the Kargil War, Lahore Bus Diplomacy and Balakot Airstrike. He concluded by highlighting that the model of development under the leadership of Narendra Modi had an impact on Pakistan's policy and politics.

II. CGS Samiksha 2023: Field Visits, Forecasting and Felicitation

i) CGS Samiksha 2023: North East

The CGS Samiksha has been the incredible flagship election study program of the Centre beginning 2017. To undertake the 9th election survey to the North East region under CGS Samiksha series, the Centre organised an online election workshop on Wednesday, 1 February 2023 in order to conduct the election surveys for three North Eastern States, viz., Tripura, Meghalaya and Nagaland where assembly elections were due in the month of February 2023. The Centre organized both online and offline workshops engaging students and scholars of University of Delhi as well as the Universities and Colleges in the poll-bound states.

The first Samiksha workshop on North East was followed by many other workshops undertaken by the Centre's Fellow Coordinators by making the student researchers aware of the practices of conducting election surveys and the challenges related to it. In this light, the interactive sessions in the workshop alleviated a platform where under the academic and enriching guidance, the fellows and researchers dive to gain wisdom through new exploratory and refreshing ideas.

Field Explorations of Tripura, Meghalaya and Nagaland Assembly Elections

Coordinated under the guidance and direction of Dr Ramesh Bhardwaj and Dr Mahesh Kaushik, CGS Samiksha North East 2023 was executed at the ground by the State Coordinators Shri Vikas Yadav, Ms Srishty and Ms Ragini Jha representing Tripura, Meghalaya and Nagaland respectively. All the three State Coordinators were assisted in their mission by the offline and online teams of various poll-bound colleges and universities in addition to University of Delhi.



CGS Samiksha North East 2023 successfully covered all 36 districts and 178 constituencies gauging voting patterns of electors in all the three states of the region. With one of its solitary initiatives to the distinct and distant destination, the Centre has marked its presence as an esteemed social science research institution engaged in rigorous research activities. In this spirit, the Centre promotes political practices and focuses on analysing the changing dynamics of Indian polity. The extensive election survey series under CGS Samiksha marks the Centre as a leading national research institute on psephological studies in the country. The accurate projections of our electoral surveys have been acclaimed not only by the reputed national and state media but also by acclaimed national institutions.

Felicitating North East

The Centre organised a National Workshop and Felicitation Program on North East on 18th March 2023 to celebrate the successful completion and electoral validation of CGS Samiksha North East 2023. Shri Ajay K Mehra, Commissioner (EPFO), Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India was the Chief Guest on the occasion. The coordinators, team leaders, surveyors, Principals, Head of Departments and students who played vital role in accomplishing Samiksha North East 2023 were felicitated by the Chief Guest and the Director on this occasion. Speaking from the podium, the



Chief Guest congratulated the Centre for undertaking its Mission Samiksha under adversity and wished the Students and Scholars present for their prosperous academic career.

ii) CGS Samiksha 2023: Karnataka Assembly Election Survey Workshop

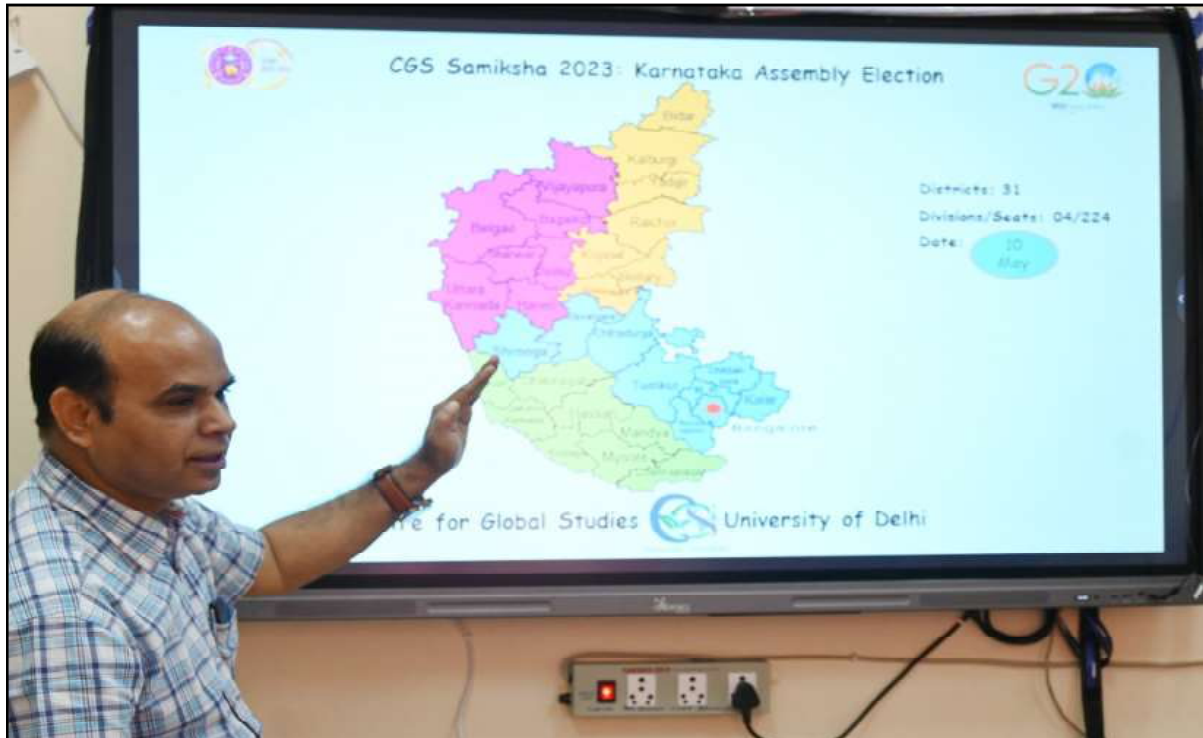
The Centre organised the CGS Samiksha 2023: Karnataka Assembly Election Survey online workshop on 5 April 2023 to impart psephological knowledge to all researchers and surveyors for conducting offline Karnataka Assembly Election Survey. The workshop was attended by many college and postgraduate students of the University of Delhi. Prof. Sunil K Choudhary, the Director of the Centre gave an orientation on Samiksha Series to the surveyors and wished them the best for undertaking the upcoming field research, touching the southern part of the nation to its first survey venture. The Samiksha Workshop was also attended by Prof Pawan Sinha and Prof Sanjeev Kumar, eminent Political Scientists of University of Delhi.



iii) Karnataka Survey Result Workshop

The Centre organised Karnataka Survey Result Workshop on 13th May 2023 to celebrate the successful completion and electoral validation of CGS Samiksha 2023: Karnataka Assembly Elections. The coordinators, team leaders, surveyors, and students who played an instrumental role in accomplishing

Samiksha 2023: Karnataka were congratulated for their hard work by the director on this occasion. Prof. Sunil Choudhary, Director, CGS interacted with all fellows, researchers, students and surveyors and applauded them for their successful attempts in highlighting the voting behaviour of citizens belonging to Karnataka.



iv) CGS Samiksha 2023: Mizoram, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Telangana

A systematic, scientific and objective online and offline survey was conducted by the Centre for Global Studies, University of Delhi to study the recent Assembly elections. This is the eleventh major election survey conducted by the Centre in the series of ‘CGS Samiksha’. The Centre estimated the emergence of a hung assembly assembly in Mizoram and Telangana, Indian National Congress (INC) in Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in Rajasthan elections by a survey study conducted on the basis of its own unique methodology.

This trend of election results by the Centre was based on the study of 27,220 voters of 40 seats in Mizoram, 90 seats in Chhattisgarh and 230 seats in Madhya Pradesh, 199 seats in Rajasthan, 119 seats in Telangana during October 31- November 27, 2023. The survey was conducted by the Centre

in association with approximately 2000 students and research scholars from various colleges/institutions/universities all across the poll-bound states. The survey was conducted extensively in the blended mode. The Director of the Centre, Prof Sunil K. Choudhary described the election surveys as an ‘democratic uprising’ of New India as against ‘democratic sliding’ of the West.

The Mizoram, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Telangana 2023 election surveys attempted to conduct election studies based on a critical, objective and scientific research methodology in social sciences. The ‘CGS Samiksha’ is the only psephological study series in the electoral history of postindependence India that is more comprehensive, holistic, scientific and objective than any other electoral survey institution in India.

III. CGS Global Connectivity: Delegation and Visitors

➤ Visit by the Argentine Delegation

The Centre warmly welcomed the Argentina delegation on 25th July 2023 at the centre and felicitated the team with souvenirs. The delegation had eminent academicians, administrators and professionals from universities based in Santa Fe, Argentina. ➤ **Delegation from Kazakhstan**

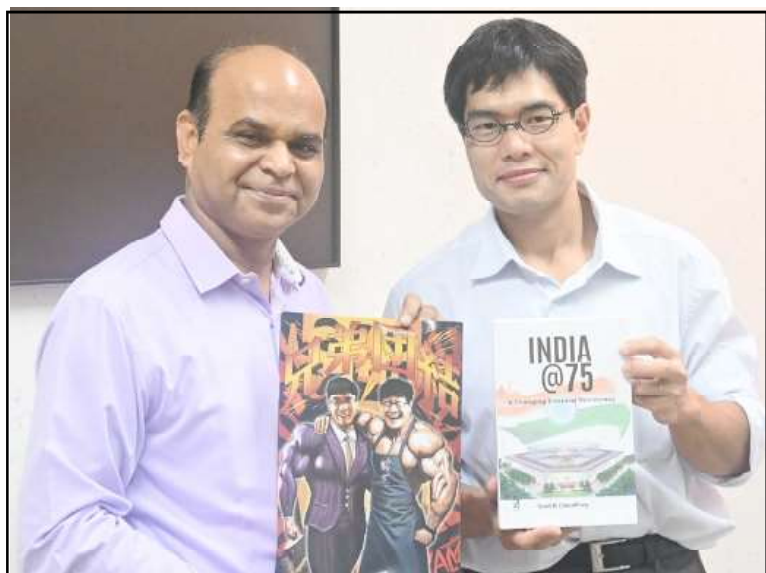

The visit of the Japanese scholar was enriching and enlightening in terms of sharing inter-government relations between the countries. The discussion highlighted the changing

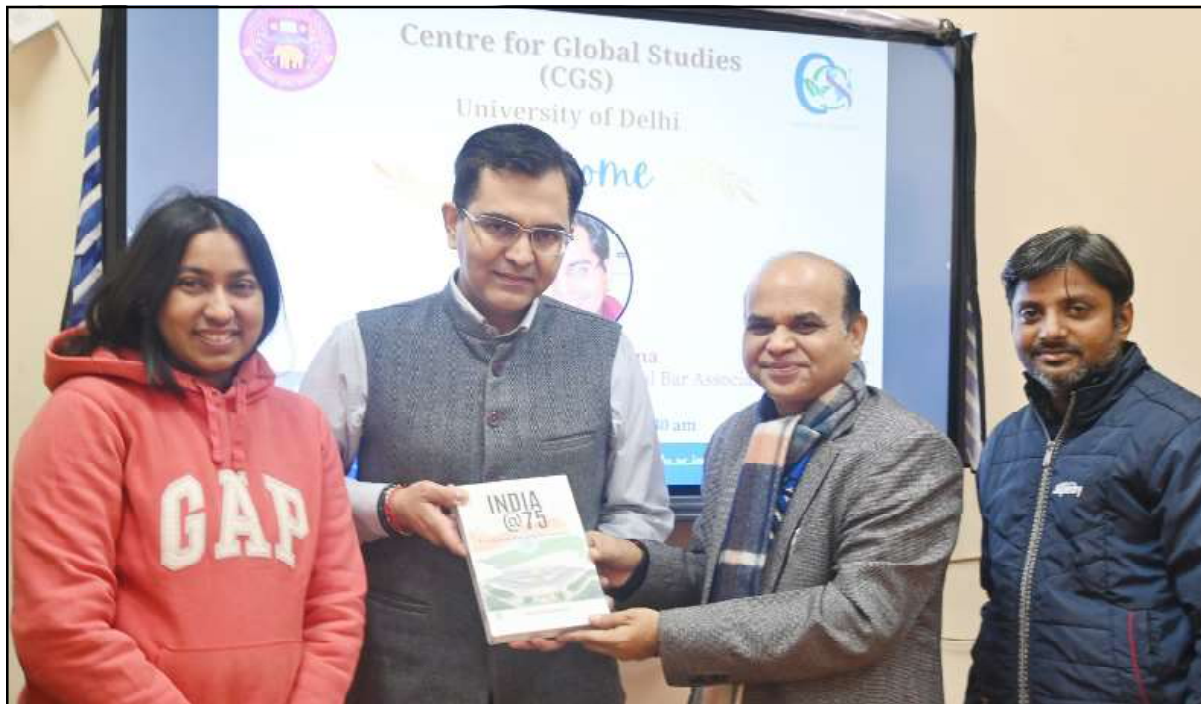


nature of electoral politics in Japan from a broader perspective and the impact of India on the democratic politics of Japan.
